HISTORY OF CSLA

In 1983, the students and staff of the Yorkton Regional High School were invited to host the annual provincial leadership conference of 1985. A year later the Premier of Saskatchewan, the Hon. Grant Devine, challenged the Yorkton students to turn the 1985 provincial conference into a national conference. This would be one of Saskatchewan's contributions to the 1985 International Year of the Youth project.

The students and staff of Yorkton Regional High School accepted the challenge, and the 1985 conference was held on September 18th, 19th, and 20th in Yorkton, SK. Over eight hundred students and student advisors attended this conference which had for its theme "YOUTH OF TODAY – LEADERS OF TOMORROW." Not only did the people come from all across Canada, but there were also strong delegations from five states south of the border and one delegate from Mexico City. Among the keynote speakers were Mark Scharenbroich, Pamela Wallin, Laurie Skreslet, Jack Donahue and a host of others from within and outside Canada.

The advisors at the Yorkton conference voted unanimously to support the idea of an annual leadership conference across the nation. Provinces and Territories would be invited to host these conferences. Through the interest, effort, and commitment of these advisors, the Canadian Association of Student (Government) Advisors, now known as the Canadian Student Leadership Association, was born.

En 1983, les élèves et le personnel enseignant de Yorkton Regional High School ont été invités à organ iser le congrès de leadership provincial annuel de 1985. Un an plus tard, le premier ministre de la Sas katchewan, l'honorable Grant Devine, a mis les élèves au défi de faire de celui-ci un congrès national. Ce serait là une des contributions de la Saskatchewan à l'Année internationale de la jeunesse de 1985.

Le défi a été accepté par les élèves et le personnel enseignant de l'école et le congrès de 1985 a eu lieu à Yorkton les 18, 19 et 20 septembre. Il avait pour thème « Jeunes d'aujourd'hui, leaders de de main » et plus de huit cents élèves et conseillers étudiants y ont participé. Non seulement les gens sont venus de partout au Canada, mais il y avait des délégations importantes de cinq États américains et un délégué de Mexico. Parmi les conférenciers principaux se trouvaient Mark Scharenbroich, Pame la Wallin, Laurie Skreslet, Jack Donahue et d'autres en grand nombre venus du Canada et d'ailleurs.

Au congrès de Yorkton, les conseillers ont voté de manière unanime en faveur d'un congrès de leadership annuel pour tout le pays. Les provinces et les territoires du Yukon et du Nord-Ouest seraient invités à en être les hôtes. Grâce à l'intérêt, aux efforts et à l'engagement de ces conseillers, l'Association cana dienne des conseillers (l'Association canadienne de leadership étudiant) en gestion étudiante a vu le jour.





In 1985, the United Nations decreed that that year be the "International Year of Youth." This was also the year that the first Canadian Student Leadership Conference was held in Yorkton, Saskatchewan where Raymond Smuk, a Yorkton Regional High School student, designed and carved The Doves to represent Youth, Participation, Development and Peace in the year of Youth. The Doves sculpture has been passed on from conference to conference becoming an enduring symbol of mentoring, cooperation and leadership. The Doves are the common thread that connects the past, present, and future Canadian Student Leadership Conferences.

In 2016, work was completed on the Doves, which included refurbishments and the addition of a second base. This work was completed by Beurnald Doiron, a teacher from Cités des Jeunes, A.M. Sormany (CSLC-CCLE 2016 host school). The addition of the second base is a testament to the enduring leadership legacy of CSLC to schools and communities across the country.

He is also the appointed Inclusion Leader for the NWHL advisory board. Through his efforts, Harrison was recognized in 2016 by The Hockey News as one of hockey's 100 Top People of Power.

THE HONOURABLE MURRAY SINCLAIR

The Honourable Murray Sinclair is a member of the Peguis First Nation. He is a Fourth Degree Chief of the Midewiwin Society, a traditional healing and spiritual society of the Anishinaabe Nation responsible for protecting the teachings, ceremonies, laws, and history of the Anishinaabe. His Spirit Name is Mizhana Gheezhik (The One Who Speaks of Pictures in the Sky).

He served as Co-Chair of the Aboriginal Justice Inquiry of Manitoba and as Chief Commissioner of Canada's Indian **Residential Schools Truth and Reconciliation** Commission (TRC). As head of the TRC, he participated in hundreds of hearings across Canada, culminating in the TRC's widely influential report in 2015. He also oversaw an active multi-million dollar fundraising program to support various TRC events and activities, and to allow survivors to travel to attend TRC events. In 2017 Governor General Julie Payette awarded him and the other TRC Commissioners the Meritorious Service Cross (Civilian) (MSC) for service to Canada for their work on the TRC.





How to Download Virbela:

- 1. On <u>Monday, October 3rd</u>, every student and advisor who is registered for CSLC will receive an email that will include a link to the CSLC Virbela Onboarding Webpage. Please click on this link when you receive it to begin the download process.
- 1. Once you click on the link, the download for the Virbela campus should start right away. However, if the downloading process does not start right away, you can click on the download link for your specific computer.
 - a. For example, if you have a Mac, download the Virbela campus compatible with Mac. If you have a PC, download the Virbela campus compatible with PC.
 - b. Please note that Chromebooks do not support the Virbela software. You will need to use a Mac or PC.
- Register your account using the email you provided us at registration. This is the same email that you will receive CSLC 2022 communications to.
 - a. Registering your account/setting up your Virbela avatar will take around 30 minutes, so please plan on setting up your account as early as possible.




We will be using Slido to allow students and advisors the opportunity to directly interact with speakers and workshop presenters. We recommend that students and advisors use their phones to use Slido.

YMCA Virtual Exchange Program



At YMCA Youth Exchanges Canada (YEC) we have been busy working with leaders and young people from Coast to Coast to Coast to facilitate meaningful and engaging exchanges between groups of youth aged 12-17 from all across this country. We are ready to offer our new Virtual Exchange Program so that you and your students can connect with others, learn about each other's community and explore the cultural diversity of another part of Canada.

A virtual exchange program includes many elements of our traditional in-person exchanges, providing participants an opportunity to learn more about Canada, connect with new people, and develop new skills. Instead of traveling between communities, youth will develop and complete activities virtually, share their communities with each other, and build relationships via technology.

As with our in-person exchanges, YEC has project cost funding to support groups with barriers to participation. This year these funds will be used to support the infrastructure of the virtual exchange program such as internet, cellular data, or a webcam, and funding activity-related costs, such as food and supplies. We are committed to making both of our exchange options as accessible as possible for all Canadian youth.

This program is available for groups of 10-30 youth, from 12 to 17 years of age. Thanks to the Department of Canadian Heritage, we are able to support groups by providing guidance, training, and project costs.
