Registration Timeline & Details

Registration for CSLC 2023 opens on March 9, 2023 at 10am ET for member schools

Non-member school registration will open on March 16th, 2023 at 10am ET

Initial Registration will be **1 advisor and 3 students/school**, across approximately 165 schools. Additional delegates will be placed on the waitlist.

Cost to attend CSLC 2023 is **\$350/delegate**, plus the \$90 CSLA membership fee for the 2023-2024 school year.

Payment methods include e-transfer/direct deposit, cheque, and credit card. Credit card payments will be subject to a 4% processing fee.

Payments for CSLC 2023 are due on May 15th.

Any unpaid accounts after that time will have their registration cancelled and we will move to the waitlist.

Any cancellations after the payment deadline (May 15th) will be subject to a cancellation fee:

- Cancellation before June 15th full refund minus \$100/delegate cancelled
- Cancellation after June 15th no refund
- Delegates may be swapped for another individual from the same school or school district
- Cancellations due to medical reasons after the June 15th deadline will receive a full refund minus \$100 administration fee with a doctors note

Travel and Accommodation

There will be no billet accommodations available at CSLC 2023 in Saint John. NB. Due to the current state of schools following heightened periods of the Covid-19 pandemic, it will be the responsibility of the school to arrange and pay for their accommodations at CSLC 2023.

To make this process as simple as possible, CSLC 2023 has secured room blocks at 6 Saint John hotels for our delegates. We have also secured discounts for travel, and a subsidy program funded by the Government of Canada to offset these additional costs. The CSLC 2023 committee has also lowered the regular registration rate to help support these added expenses.

Discount cannot be applied after the booking is confirmed and paid so is important the code is entered at the beginning of the booking process.

Travel and Accomodation Subsidy Program

A Travel Subsidy Program will be made available post conference through funding from the Government of Canada – Department of Canadian Heritage Youth Forums Program. This year, this funding will also include dollars to offset youth accommodation. The exact amount of subsidy will not be known until after CSLC, but we have provided a cost estimate here based on travel from the furthest province (British Columbia) for you:

Before Subsidy:

Travel from YVR: \$1066
Accommodation Cost: \$252

Total Student Cost to Attend: \$1668

- 1. Keep all travel and accommodation receipts and submit in-person at CSLC
- 2. Complete required travel subsidy registration form (available at CSLC)
- 3. Ensure your travel and accommodations are booked at the best possible rate we will not fund high-fare travel (ex. business/first class/etc). Please book standard/economy/flex fares for air travel, and conference rates for hotel stays.

Please note:

Only youth/student travel and accommodations are subsidized

The goal of the program is to equalize the cost of travel and hotel accommodation to make the program as accessible as possible

Insurance, Safety and Security

Insurance

The Canadian Student Leadership Association holds a \$2 million general liability insurance policy to support the safety of our team and program participants. If you require a copy of this policy, please contact Maddie Campbell.

Emergency Procedures

Each conference location, including Saint John High School and the Delta hotel, will have emergency procedures in place to support the safety of student delegates. Our youth spirit leaders will also undergo training of these protocols and procedures to help keep their peers safe during the program. Emergency contacts will be determined on site and information will be provided to conference participants.

Code of Conduct

Every student, advisor, volunteer and committee member of the Canadian Student Leadership Conference will sign and submit a code of conduct. This code of conduct will outline conference rules, expectations and information that will help ensure an enjoyable experience for all delegates. These code of conducts will be available shortly – but to summarize – if it is a school rule, it is a conference rule.

Our Committment to Safety

The CSLC 2023 will act at every step with the safety of student leaders and their advisors in mind. If the conference committee deems anything unsafe to delegates, action will be taken immediately. Any infractions of the conference delegate code of conduct will be subject to that delegate being immediately removed from the program and sent home at their own cost.

Emergency Protocol

Advisors, it is important to have emergency protocols in place in case of any unexpected events. Here are some tips to help ensure the safety of everyone involved:

- 1. Create a detailed itinerary of the trip that includes contact information for all staff members and participants.
- 2. Designate a primary contact person in charge of the trip and provide their contact information to all participants.
 - a. CSLC 2023 Emergency Staff Contacts will be available upon registration check-in
- 3. Have a plan in place for what to do in case of an emergency. This should include a list of emergency numbers such as the police and hospitals.
 - a. CSLC 2023 to provide this information on site
- 4. Have a way to check-in with all participants throughout the day and give a report to the primary contact person.
- 5. Make sure all participants are well aware of any safety protocols and know what to do in case of an emergency.
- 6. Have an emergency medical kit on hand with all necessary items in case of an injury or illness.
 - a. CSLC 2023 will have physical and mental health first-aid on site at all conference sites
- 7. Establish a curfew for the evening and make sure all participants are aware of it.
 - a. 11pm lights out nightly unless otherwise indicated

By following these tips, you can ensure that your travel experience is as safe and enjoyable as possible.

Additional on-site procedures will be shared and reviewed upon arrival at CSLC 2023.
